



## The Challenge in Central Puget Sound: Integrating the Water Needs of the Environment and the Urban Area

#### **Context:**

- ESA Listing of chinook salmon as endangered
- Washington's largest urban area with a majority of State's population
- Significant economic and population growth in Central Puget Sound (2-4% pa)
- Highly fractious set of interests/entities (3 major cities, 3 counties, 5+ watersheds, 3 major surface water supply systems, 130+ water suppliers, multiple resource agencies)

#### **Imperatives:**

- Recognition that needs for both fish and people be jointly recognized
- Coordination of competing agendas between interests/entities/salmon species
- Comprehensive picture of water needs and requirements for Central Puget Sound

## The Response to the Challenge Creation of the Central Puget Sound Water Suppliers Forum

#### **Key Elements:**

- Entirely voluntary
- Initially led by the three largest cities with the major supply system (Seattle, Tacoma, Everett) and following, key major suburban water suppliers including Cascade Water Alliance
- Open to all water suppliers in the King, Pierce and Snohomish counties 130+
- Also represented were key State, Federal, Tribal and watershed stakeholders

#### **Key Intended Deliverables:**

- Collective recognition of the joint needs for "water for fish and water for people"
- Forum for resolving multiples agendas between interests/entities/resource agencies
- Development of a regional outlook
- Pursuit of long-run legislative remedies to jointly meeting water needs for fish and municipal needs

- Initially through breakthrough 2001 regional water supply outlook in 2001
- Follow up outlooks provided in 2009, 2011 and update in 2017
